A-levels are more challenging. Within the A-level family, some subjects are harder to achieve higher grades in than others.



New A-Level Structures

A-Levels are becoming 2 year courses with final exams at the end of Year 2 only. This is being phased in over the next two years.

Students wishing to sit an AS finish that course after year 1.

We will teach A-Level and AS students together in a class in Year 12.

Can you sit them all at AS and then choose which to carry on? Yes, but these exams will count for nothing in your final A-Level score.

If you don't know which subjects you want to do to AS and which to full A-Level (most of us wouldn't!), you can make this decision during Year 12.
